Rural Watch Newsletter

Good Afternoon folks,

Please see the end of this briefing for an invite to the Rural Business Community Crime Prevention Forum this **THURSDAY 12th MARCH 2015 at 1830hrs**, Luctonians Sports Club.

A property marking event is being held in Bromyard on the 26th March 2015 at 1700hrs in the Conquest Theatre Car Park. Please bring along any bikes, horse tack, chainsaws or household items etc that you would like to be marked. You will be able to ask the officers about crime prevention for your property whilst they mark your kit. You can also take along items to Leominster at 1830hrs on 26th March, the location will be advertised on the West Mercia Web page, under Leominster Safer Neighbourhood Team before the day.

Please be advised that my email address (and that of the Safer Neighbourhood Team) is not monitored on a twenty four hour a day basis. It could be that we are on rest days, training days or simply out of the station attending incidents. For this reason, it is important that incidents are reported to Police on the 101 telephone number, so the call taker can make the decision on whether to deploy an Officer or whether to create an incident log etc. It also enables us to deal with any situation that arises in a timely manner.

Incidents

There have been numerous reports of items being stolen from commercial properties within the two industrial estates in Bromyard. Porterhouse and Linton have both been targeted by thieves. We ask that you if you work or travel through these sites, to be extra vigilant and call us on 101 if you see anything suspicious. If you have any information relating to these crimes but would prefer to remain anonymous, you can call crimestoppers on 0800 555 111

Incident Number 0136-S-100315, 166-S-080315, 147-S-070315. These incidents relate to one particular commercial property which has been targeted by thieves in the Linton trading estate. They have stolen scrap metal and batteries from the area. CCTV taken from the site is being investigated.

Incident Number 0201-S-080315. A separate commercial property on Linton trading estate was targeted by thieves. Sheds were broken into and batteries/tools were taken.

Incident Number 110-S-060315. A commercial property on the Porterhouse industrial estate was targeted whereby batteries and machinery were stolen.

Incident Number 0049-S-240215. A commercial property at the edge of the Porterhouse Industrial Estate was the target of an opportunist theft. Persons unknown made their way into an unlocked room where the safe was situated and broke the container making off with approx £3000.00 cash. Nothing was seen or heard by the business owner.

Incident Number 313-S-070215. Heating oil was stolen from a property in Thornbury. It is not known exactly when the theft occurred and there are no avenues of investigation.

Incident Number 355-S-010215. A shed in the Stoke Bliss area was damaged when thieves gained entry to the unit to steal three chainsaws. Due to the rural location, nothing was seen or heard.

Suspicious Incidents

Incident Number 198-S-270215, 229-S-170215 both relate to incidents of possible rogue traders. Two rural properties have been approached by persons asking if they want their driveways tarmaced. The driver is described as quite forceful in his selling techniques. Thankfully in both cases, the property owners have declined the services. Remember people who knock on your door selling cheap products will not have a guarantee or a money back offer. Always do your research and find a reputable supplier to carry out any works and don't get scammed.

Incident Number 0332-S-030315 A suspicious vehicle was seen in the Stoke Lacy area. A Volkswagon transporter SA54 VZG was reportedly driving slowly around the properties. Enquiries are being made with the registered keeper of the vehicle.

Incident Number 0025-S-020315 A property owner was woken up by a bin being knocked over in his garden. The property owner then switched on a light which disturbed the males who then ran off. Officers were dispatched but could find no trace of the males.

Incident Number 0315-S-200215. A Land rover L2ECP was seen in suspicious circumstances in Bodenham. The vehicle was seen several times just driving slowly around the village. Officers were unable to trace the vehicle.

Good News

Herefordshire OPU (Roads policing unit) have been in and around Bromyard causing a few people to wish they had sorted the documentation on their cars before they ventured out!. One vehicle was seized on Tenbury Road for no tax and a vehicle was seized in Hope under Dinmore for no insurance. One driver was stopped for drink driving nr Bromyard with a reading of 118mg which is three and a half times the legal limit!

Rights that's it for me for now, remember don't make it easy for thieves, keep it locked.
